Peach	Space 18' to 25' apart. - TREE FARM	
Junegold - 450ch	Ripens in late may/early June. Good size yellow flesh peach with strong market acceptance. <i>Clingstone</i>	NO
Redskin - 750ch	Ripens in mid-July. Yellow flesh and almost solid red skin. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Elberta - 800ch	Ripens in September. Juicy, yellow fresh. Great for canning and freezing. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Early Elberta - 750ch	Ripens in early July. Yellow flesh peach and golden yellow red skin, large tree. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Florida King - 300ch	Ripens in mid May. Good flavor. Yellow skin/red blush. <i>Clingstone</i>	NO
Harvester - 750ch	Ripens in June. One of the highest yielding. Reddish-yellow fruit with yellow, sweet flesh. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Florida Prince - 150ch	Ripens in late may/early June. Golden flesh with red blush skin. <i>Semi-Freestone</i>	NO
Sam Houston - 500ch	Ripens in June. Yellow skin/red blush with yellow flesh. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Apple	25' to 30' apart. - TREE FARM	
Gala - 600ch	Ripens in September. Make large crisp apple. Good pollinator variety	YES
Red Delicious - 800ch	Ripens Mid-September to Mid-October. Tender, crisp, & sweet. Pollinate with Yellow Delicious.	YES
Yellow Delicious - 700ch	Ripens in late September. Yellow fruit, medium crispy fruit with a sweet taste. Dependable pollinator.	YES
Pink Lady - 600ch	Ripens in late October. Medium yellow/pink skin with unique tart/sweet flavor. Pollinate with Red Delicious	YES
Apricot	15' to 18' apart - TREE FARM	
Moorepark- 700ch	Ripens in early July to early August. Large, juicy, sweet-tasting apricots. <i>Freestone</i>	NO
Pear	25' to 30' apart. - TREE FARM	
Kieffer - 400ch	Ripens in late September/early October. Good fire blight resistance. Green/Yellow skin with white flesh	NO
Moonglow- 500ch	Ripens in August/September. High quality fruit with good fire blight resistance. Soft flesh	YES
Orient -300ch	Ripens late August. Large smooth round yellow fruit- red cheek and thick skin. Juicy /creamy-mild flavor.	YES
Ayers - 300ch	Ripens mid-August to September. High quality fruit with a few grit cells. Good fire blight resistance.	YES
Plum	15' to 18' apart - TREE FARM	
Bruce- 500ch	Late May. Large red plum for fresh eating or making jam. Must have pollinator. <i>Pollinates w/ Santa Rosa</i>	YES
Santa Rosa- 500ch	Late May. Large red plum for fresh eating or making jam. Great pollinator. <i>Pollinates w/ Bruce or All Red</i>	NO
Au Rosa- 700ch	Early July. Excellent quality fresh/canned. Disease/scald resistant. <i>Pollinates w/ Methley</i>	NO
Methley- 250ch	Early June. Medium sized deep purple with red flesh. Disease resistant <i>Pollinates w/ Au Rosa</i>	YES
Fig	15' to 20' apart - Need enough chill hours to produce - IN OR IN FRONT OF GREEN HOUSE	
Little Miss Figgy- 100ch	Ripens in summer. Sweet, dark purple fruits.	NO
LSU Purple- 200ch	Ripens in late June, and again in July through September. Medium-sized, glossy purple fruit. Mild flavor.	NO
Brown Turkey- 100ch	First small crop in late spring/early summer. Main harvest in early fall. Small to medium fruit, dark brown	NO
Persimmon	15' to 25' apart - TREE FARM	
Fuyu- 200ch	Non-astringent, Large round flattened reddish orange fruit. Need time to ripen but good to eat. Ripens in Oct.	NO
Giant Fuyu- 200ch	Ripens in Sept to early winter. 2x the size of a normal persimmon, sweet, honey-mango flavor.	NO
Pomegranate	5' to 6' apart - FLOWERING SECTION	
Wonderful- 200ch	Ripens in September. Large red fruit in fall. Make beautiful flowers	NO
Texas Pink- 200ch	Ripens in early Oct. Large, deep-pink fruits w/ leathery skin. Juicy flesh, unique sweet and tangy flavor.	NO
Almonds	15' to 20' apart - Need enough chill hours to produce - TREE FARM	
Nonpareil- 400ch	Heavy producer. Ripens August/September. Partial Self-Fertile. Larger yield with a pollinator.	NO, but***

We also HIGHLY recommend using soil amendment, root stimulator and treat them yearly in the early spring with a horticulture oil. Follow our pruning guide to maximize fruit production.
